EPA Chesapeake Bay Funding Opportunities for Communities

Historic funding for the Bay Watershed

- Historic federal and jurisdictional investments in Bay Program
 - BIL, IRA, increase in federal and state budgets
- Historic level of federal grants being awarded
 - \$50 Million in EPA CBPO grants in FY 2022
 - \$59 Million in EPA CBPO grants in FY 2023

EPA CBPO Opportunities for Communities


- Examples of state and NFWF funds from EPA CBPO your community may be eligible for include:
 - Local Government grants
 - •Small Watershed grants
 - Most Effective Basin grants
 - CBIG grants
 - •CBRAP grants
 - INSR grants
 - Water Quality monitoring grants

Other EPA Region 3 Funding Opportunities for Communities

- Examples of funds from EPA Region 3 your community may be eligible for include:
 - State Revolving Fund (SRF)
 - Nonpoint Source Grants
 - OSG sewer and stormwater program assistance
 - Pollution Control grants

Visualize Our Partnership's Historic Funding

- Over \$1.8 billion invested in the Chesapeake Bay Program by our state and federal partners in FY 2022-an historic commitment
- BIL significantly increased partnership investments in 2022
- Data from the 2022 CBARA report


