- 1. In your opinion, what should be the stated purpose(s) of this suite of indicators?
 - Understand basic physical trends, changes, impacts
 - Communicating those trends & impacts.
 - Making the data available
 - Communication need beyond programmatic objectives
 - Satisfying general interest for community (esp. city & county level) and homeowner level.
 - Measurements that can help inform progress and how to allocate resources
 - Optimizing decision making
 - Potential for improvement or expansion of available data
 - Actionable for next workplan
 - Relationship to BMPs (forward looking) and trends that relate
- 2. What additional considerations do you feel are important when selecting the final suite of indicators—for example, number of indicators and qualities that make for a cohesive "whole"?
 - Weaving a thread between trend/impact/response (storytelling), but without sacrificing standalone value
 - Actionable for this group, where we can offer support
 - Broader focus beyond the shoreline, including watershed-level resiliency activity (prioritize broader scope over size of resiliency effort)
 - Diversity, with eye to communication value
 - Prioritize societal value and human health components
 - Consider the coordination of the expansion of metrics
