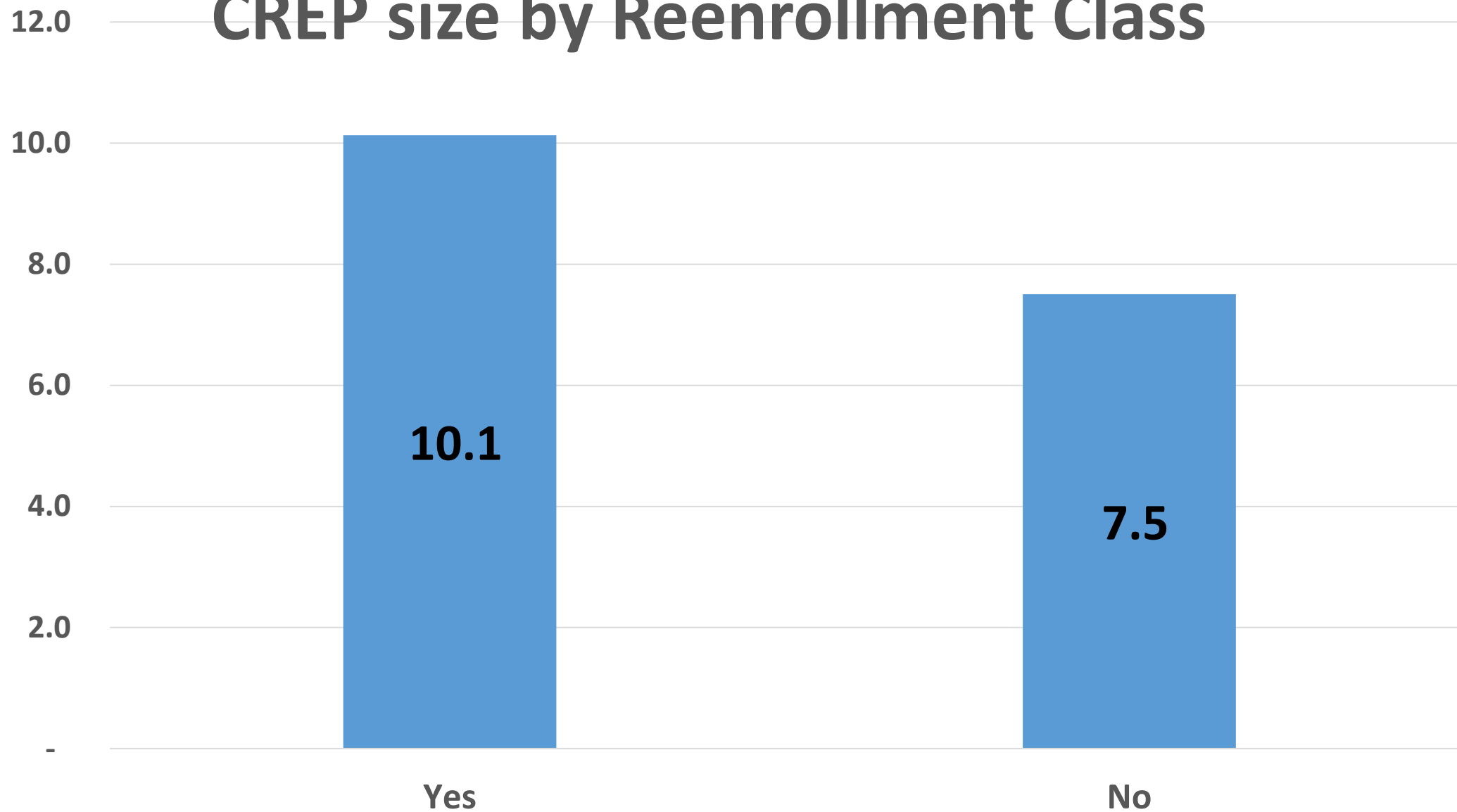

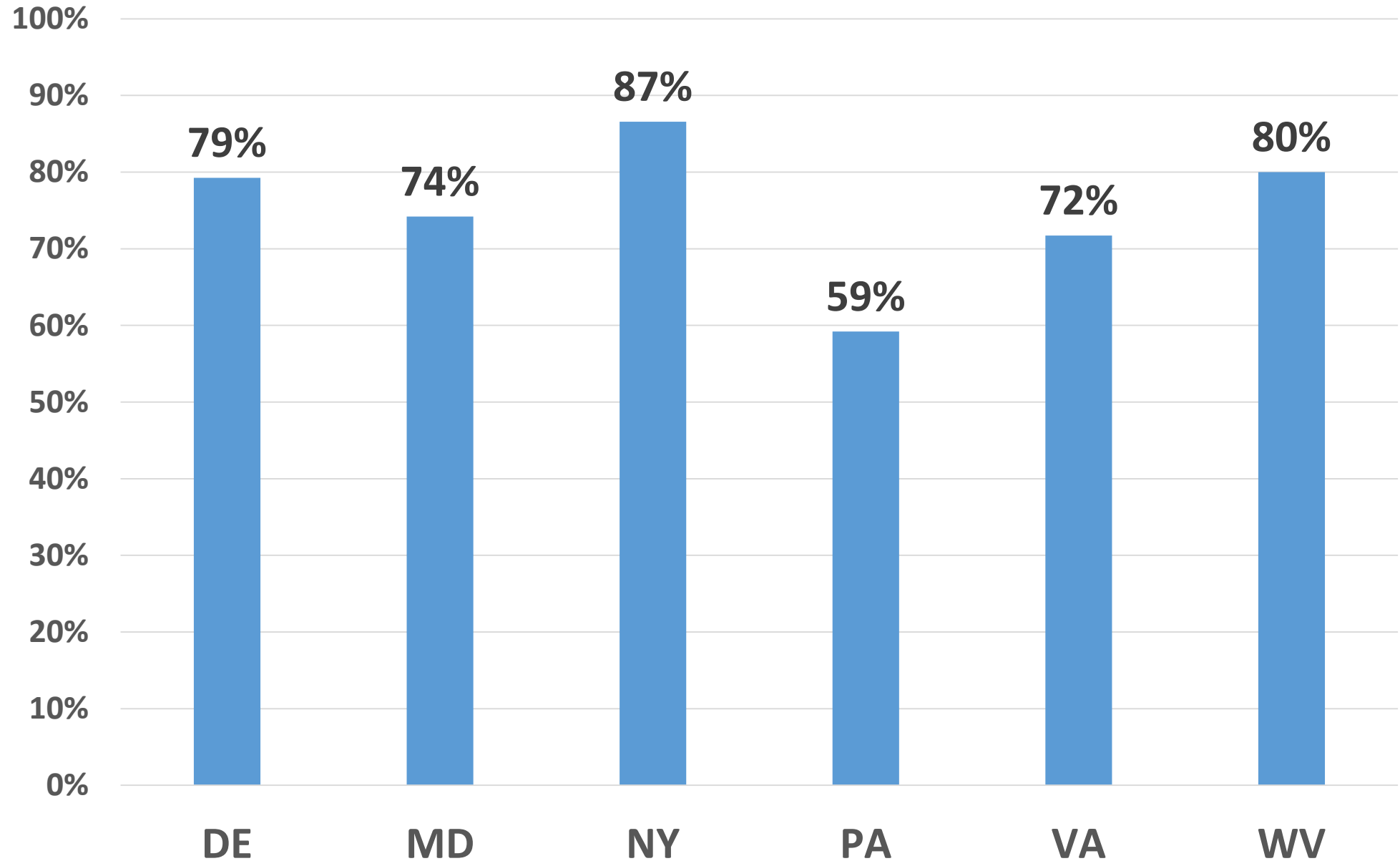

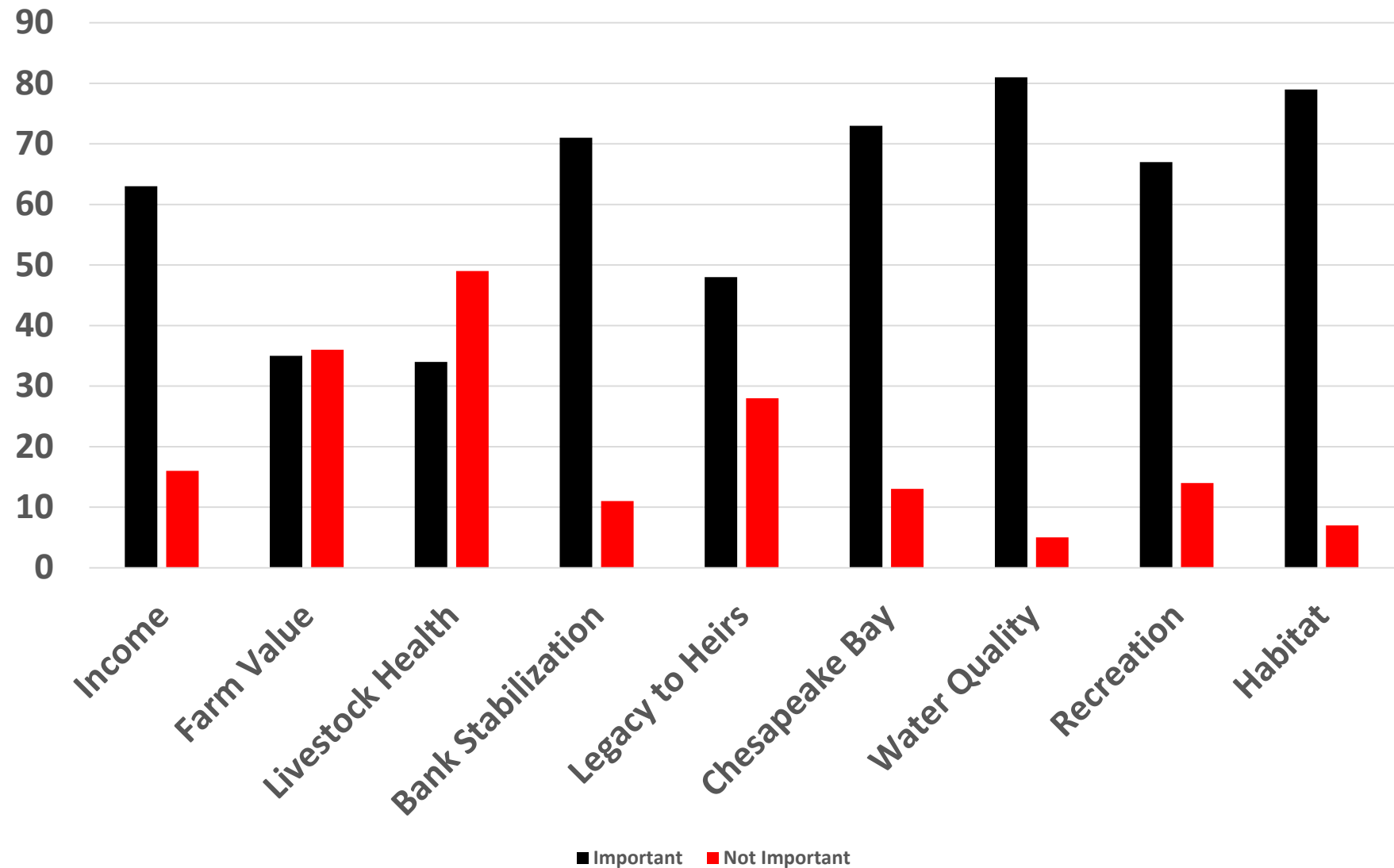
# CREP size by Reenrollment Class



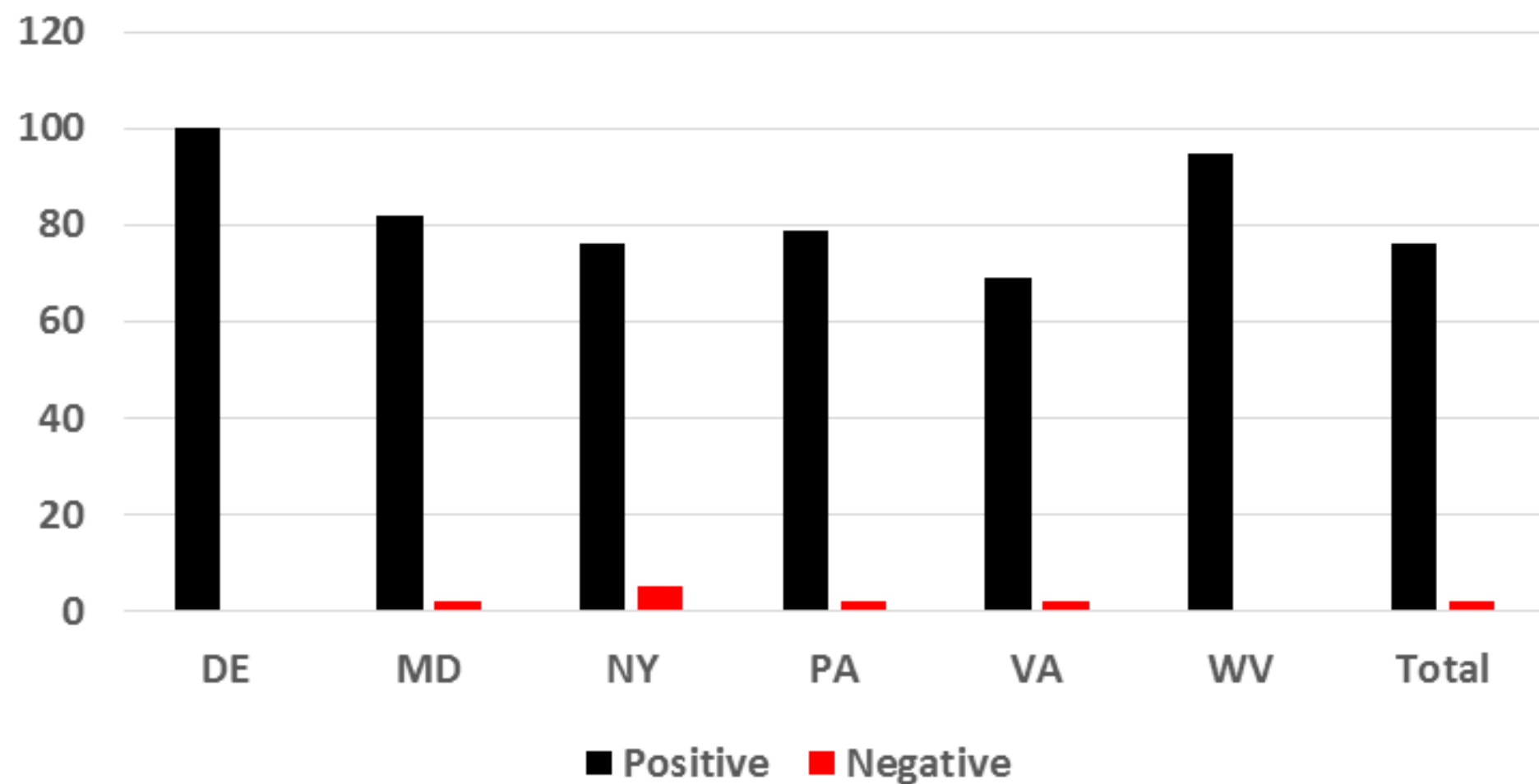
# % Reenrollment by State



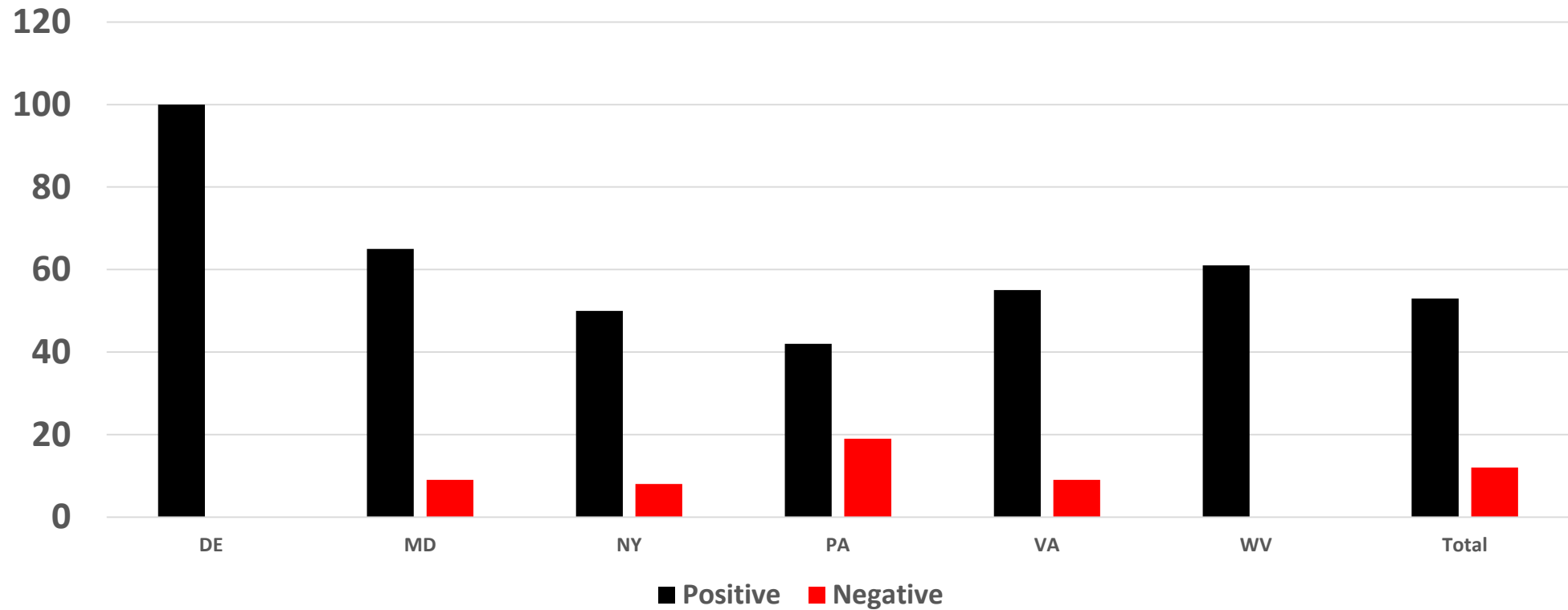

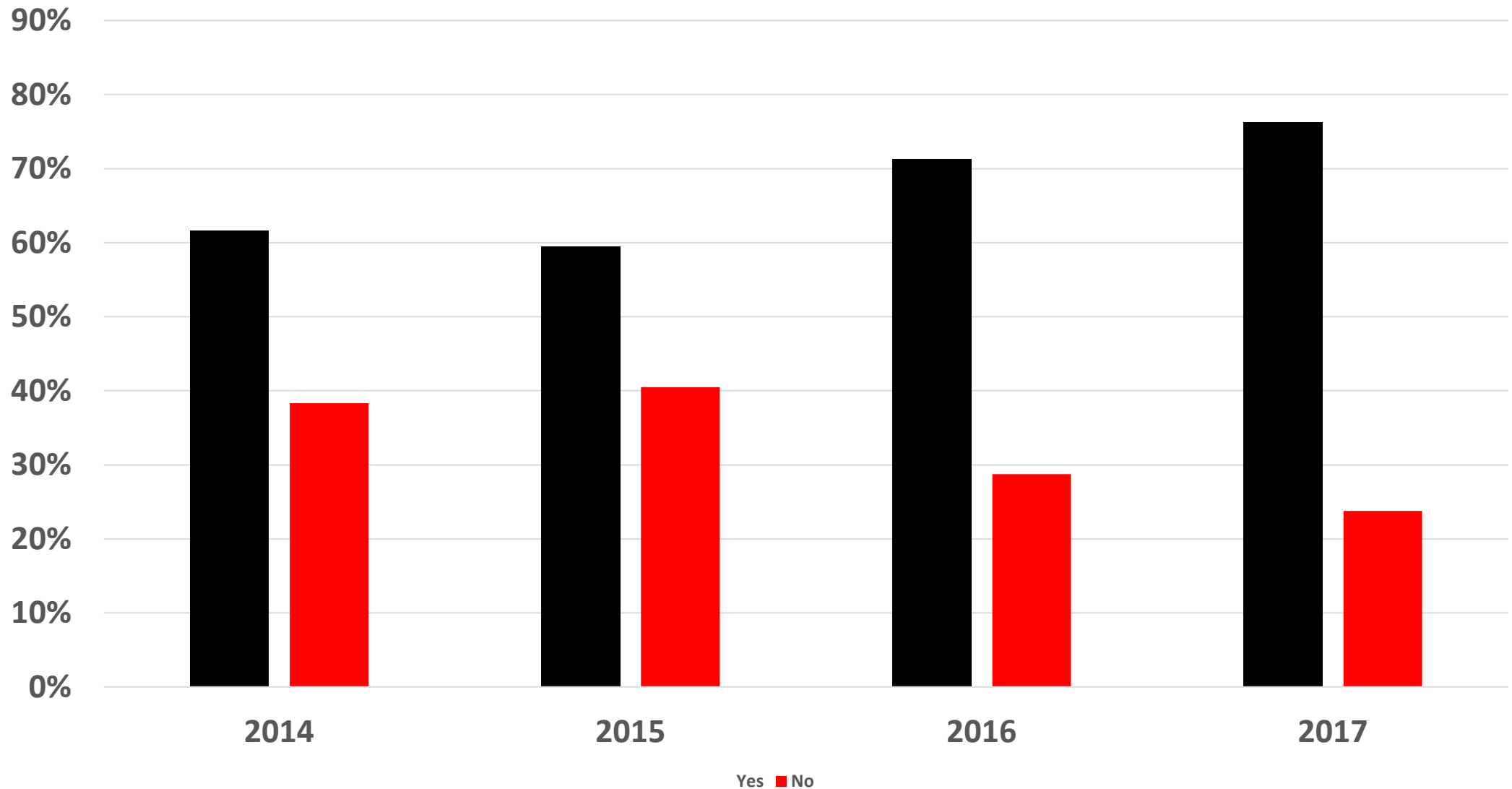
## Reenrolled % of acres by satisfaction and State



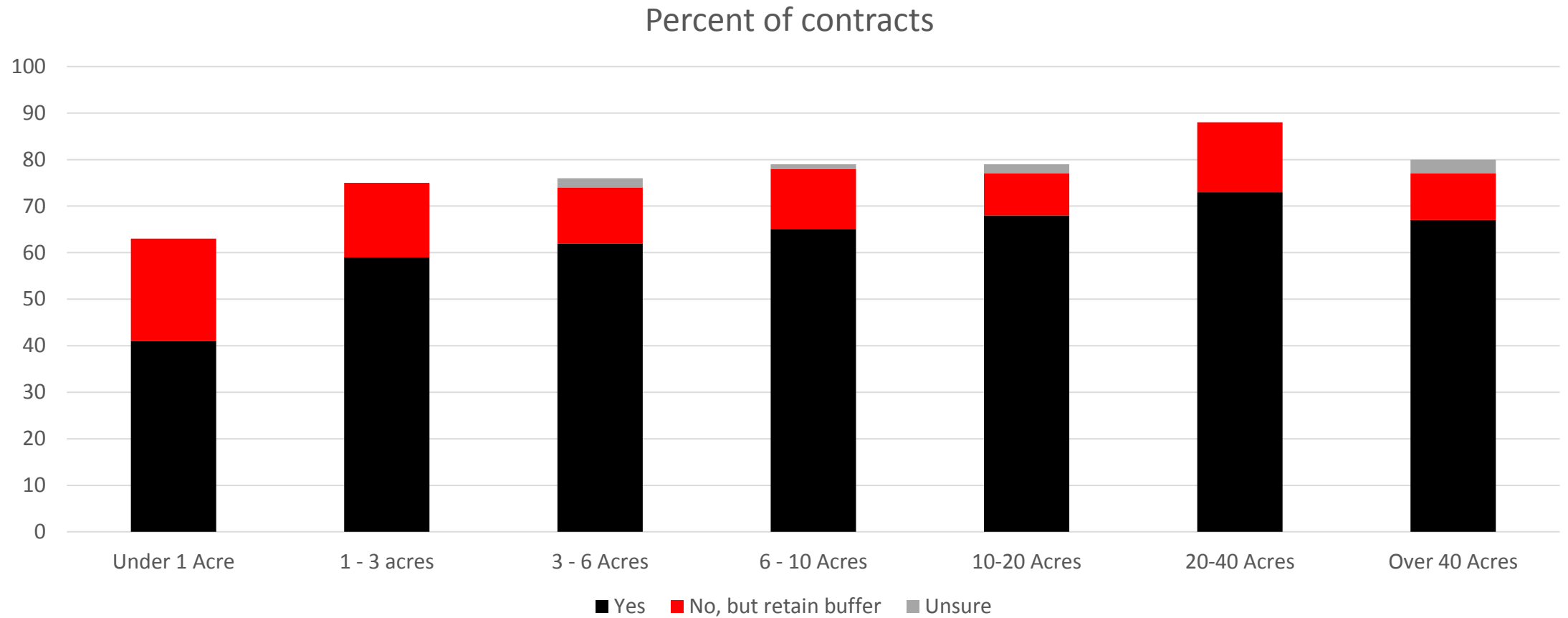
# Non-Reenrolled % of acres by satisfaction and State



# % of Acres Reenrolled by Year

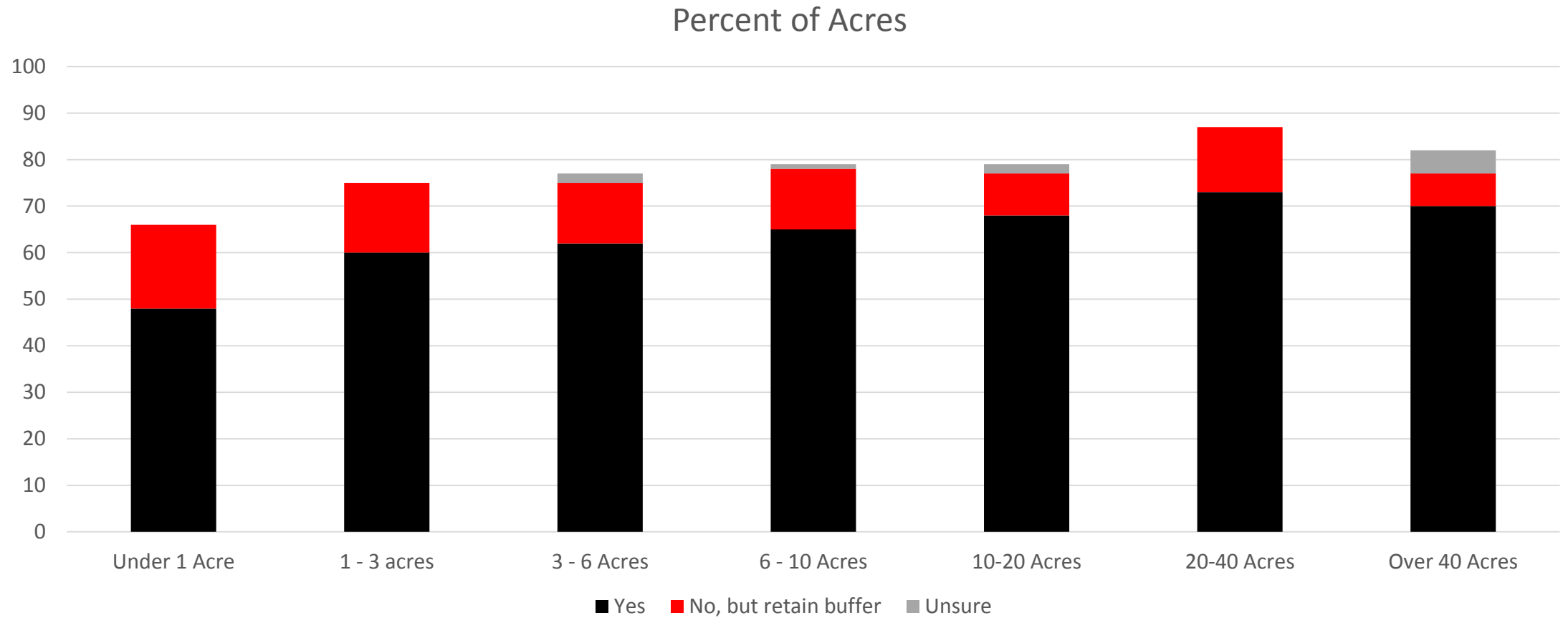

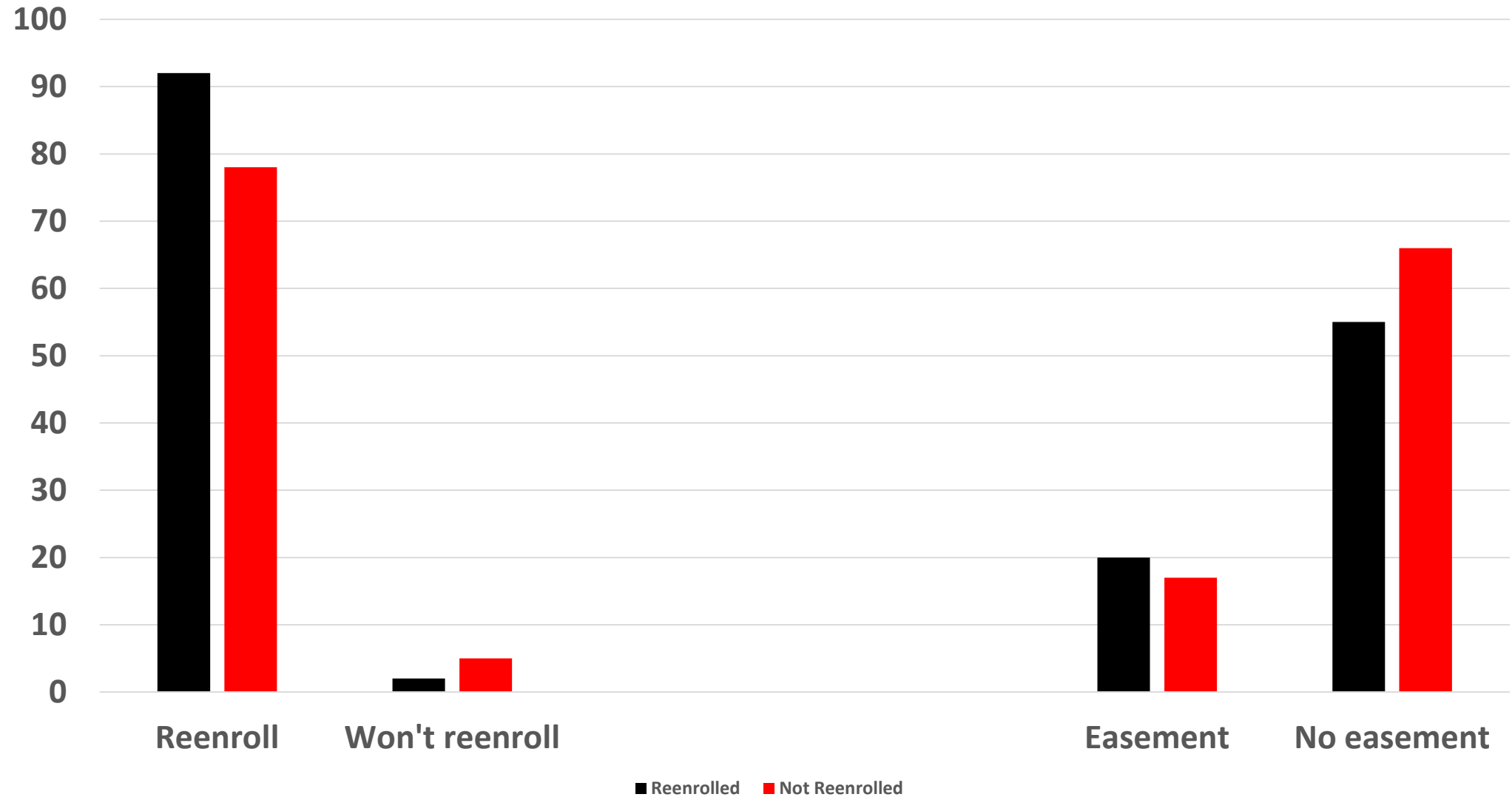

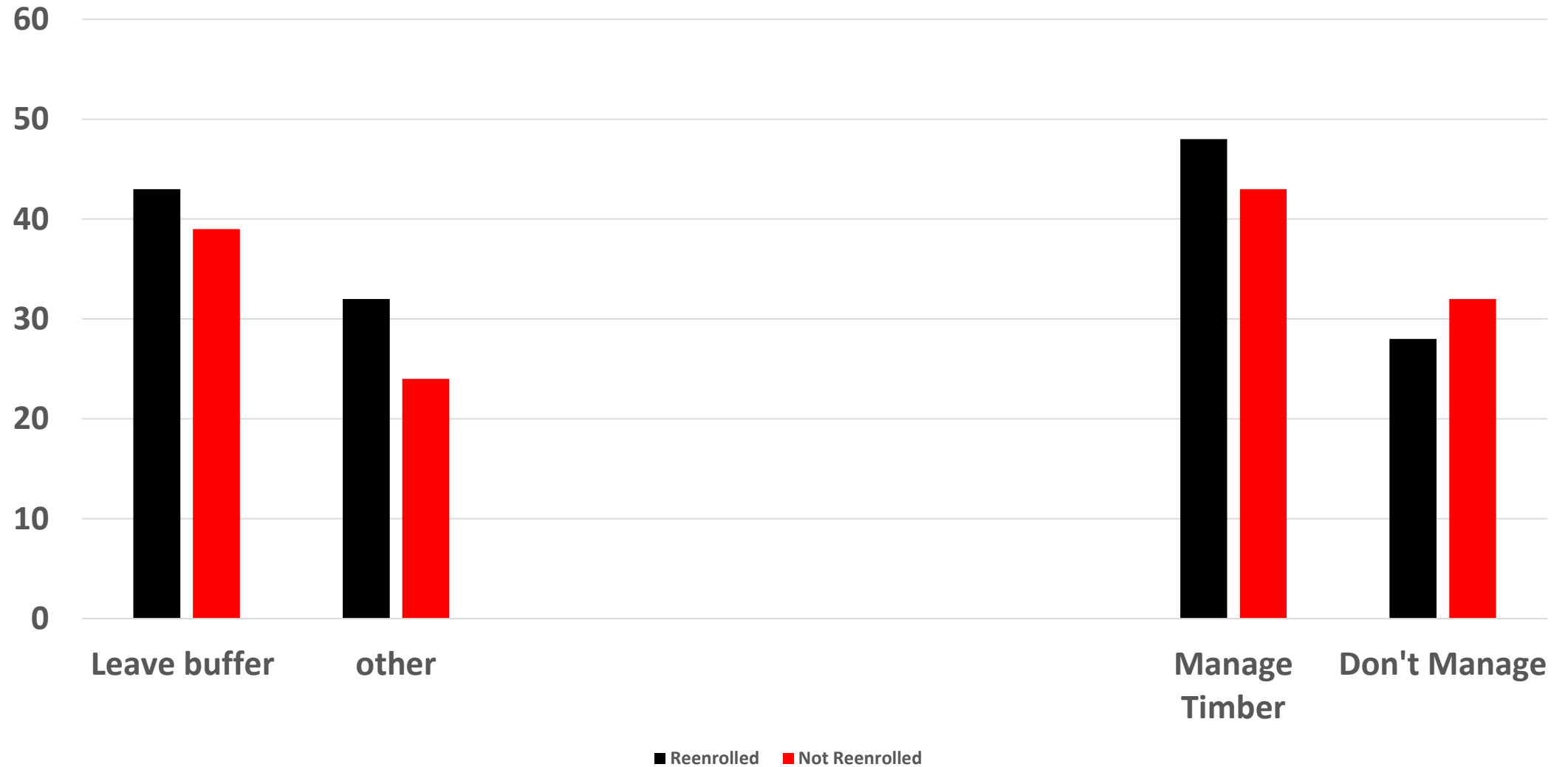

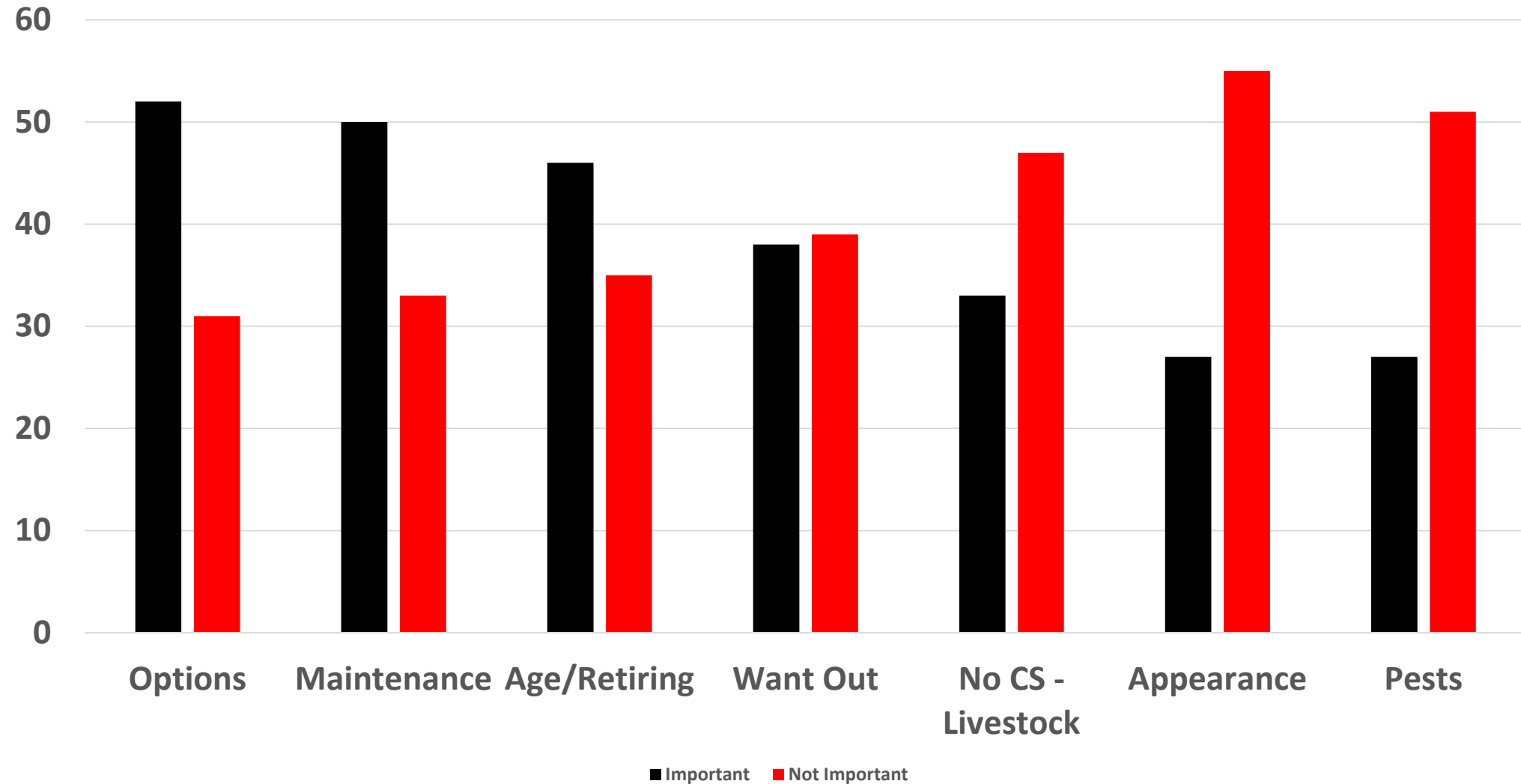

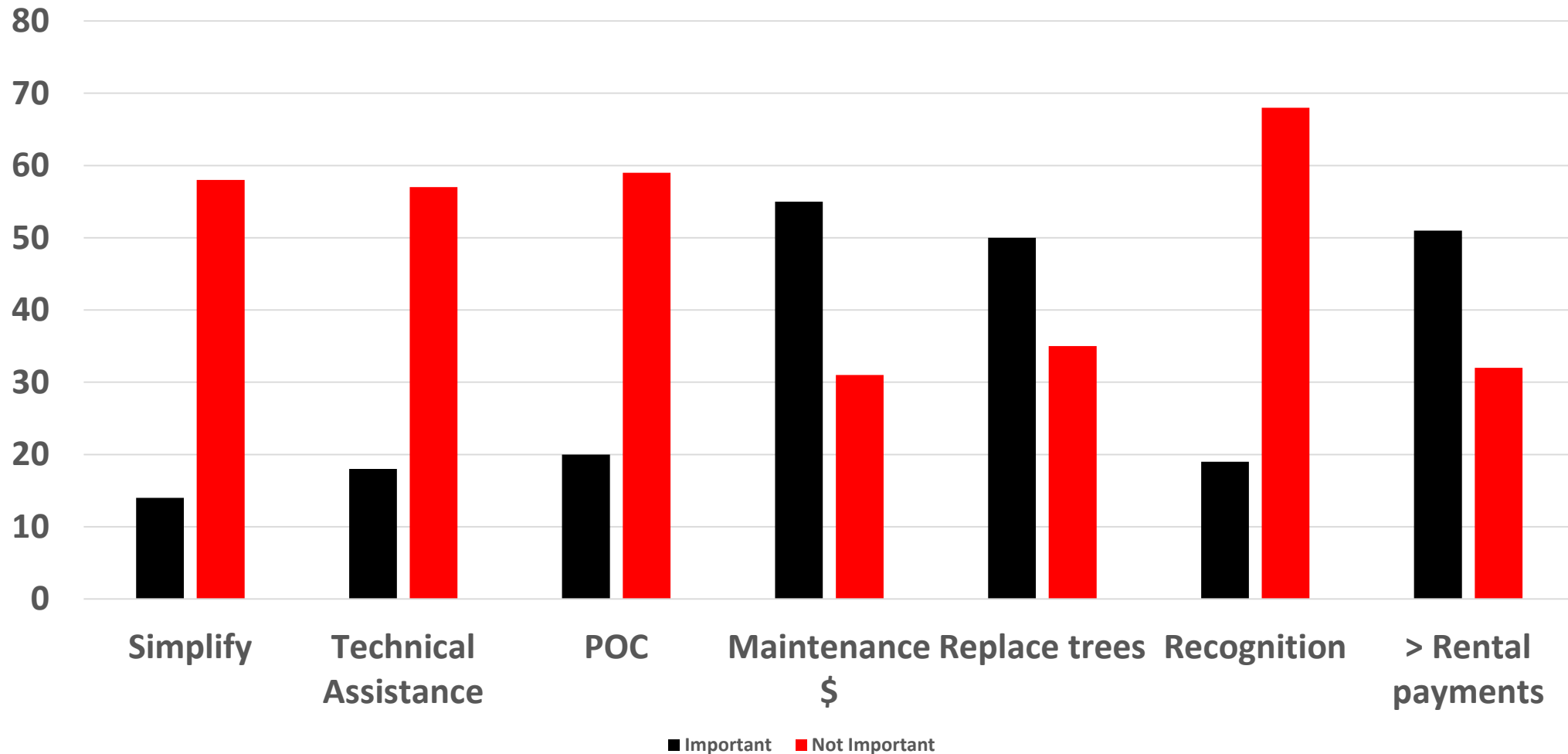
