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What have we done in the past?



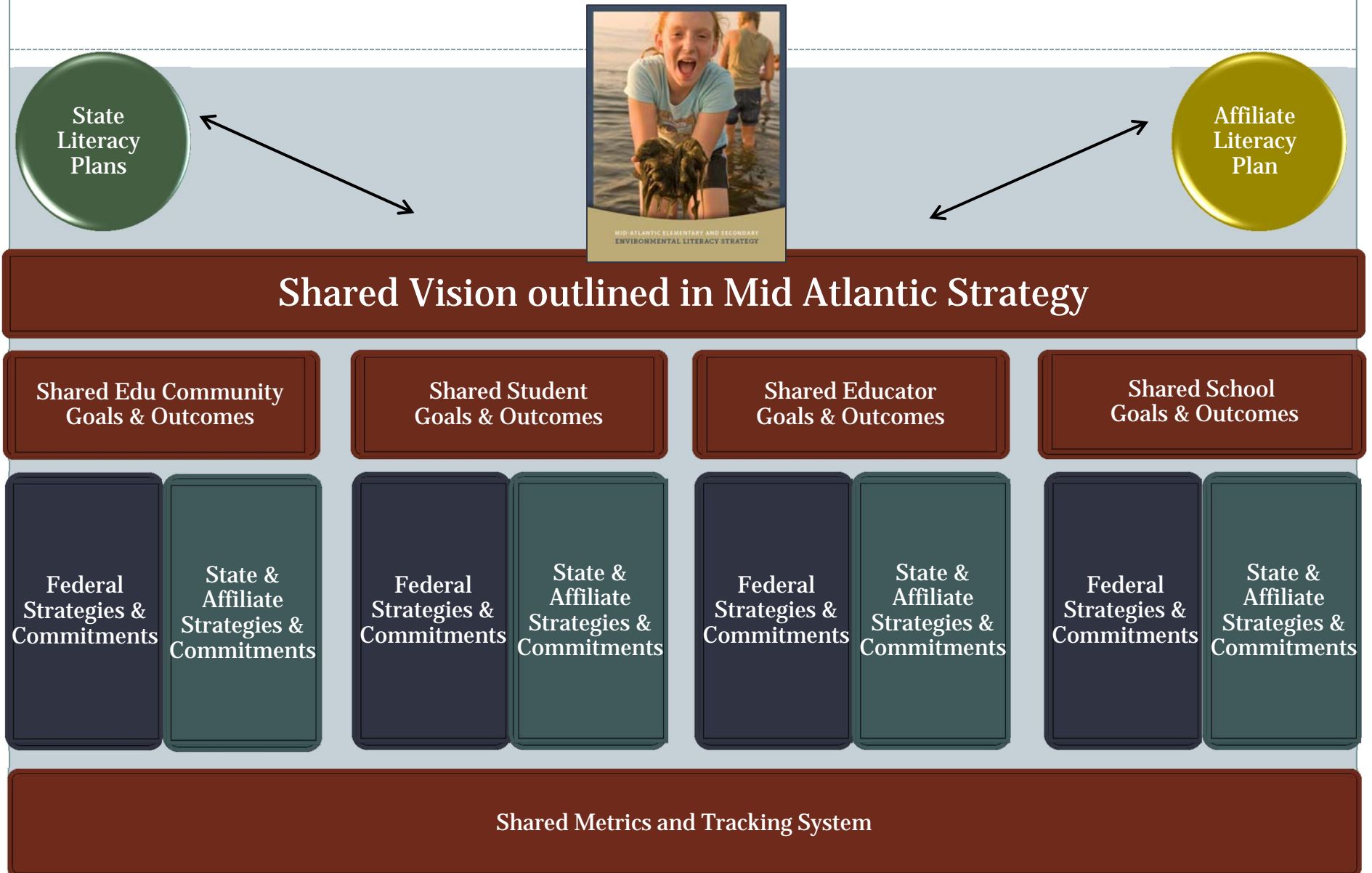
- Education Workgroup tracked MWEE progress from 2005-2009
- State departments of education (and DDOE) reported results as a percentage of public school students receiving a MWEE annually
 - Approximately 81% of elementary, 81% of middle, and 80% of high school students
- Tracking was discontinued in 2009
 - Inconsistent data
 - Non-uniform methods and rigor

Where are we now?

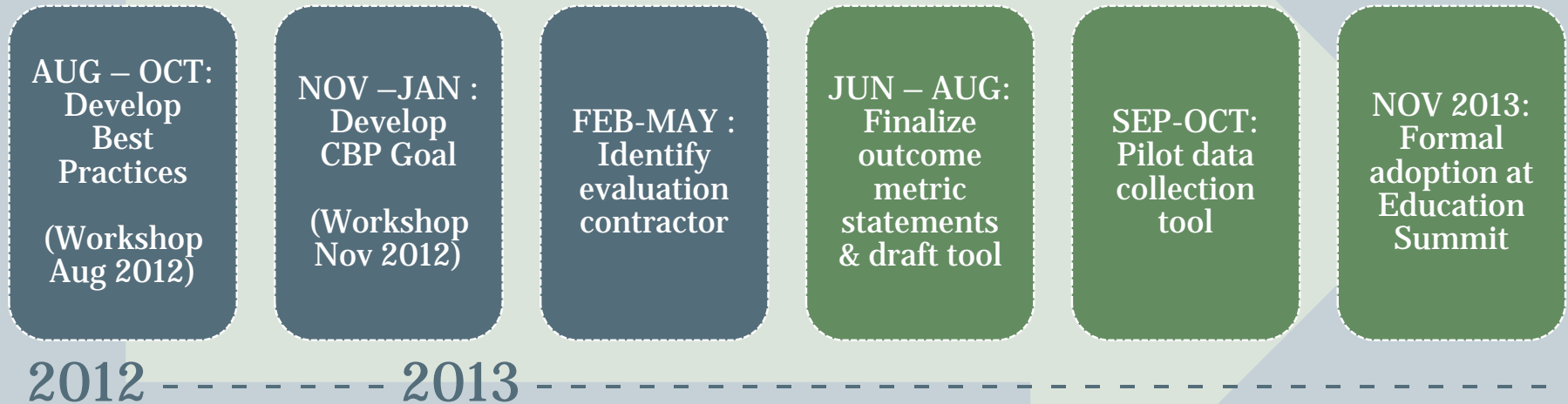
- 2009: Executive Council identifies need for two-year milestones
- 2010: ChesapeakeStat online reporting tool is released – has old data
- 2012: Workgroup releases Mid Atlantic EL Strategy & begins metrics development

Phase 2



- Voluntary, online school-based reporting tool
- Will detail BMPs, teacher training, and MWEEs at schools
