

Tree Cover Status & Change – County Fact Sheet Template

Project Summary

- The US Forest Service provided funding to Chesapeake Conservancy (CC) to develop local fact sheets summarizing the latest CBP high resolution data on tree canopy cover and change, including i-Tree Landscape outputs on tree benefits
- The 2-page County Fact Sheet template was developed and refined over many months with our project team, including input from the Forestry Workgroup at the Sept. 2021 meeting
- We are working with CC and UVM-SAL to develop a “user guide” companion document that more fully describes the datasets and gives basic guidance for interpreting and working with the data locally to inform decision making;
- Next steps:
 - o final “polish” of the 2-page template by a graphic designer
 - o when final datasets are available in late Feb/early March, CC will autopopulate the fact sheets for all counties; hopefully follow up shortly after with a version for municipalities
 - o Project info, fact sheets and related tools/datasets will be posted in some combination on CC’s website and Chesapeake Tree Canopy Network
 - o March FWG meeting-will seek your input on draft user guide and dissemination ideas for getting these out broadly for state and local use

The current version reflects prior input from FWG and other project partners, including

- Change title/labels to “tree cover” rather than tree canopy – more widely understood term and helps us combine forest and tree canopy classes into one metric
- Put the key take-aways at the top – like a headline – including the i-Tree benefits total
- Minimize narrative text – use numbers and graphics to convey the content as much as possible; point people to a companion document (“user guide”) for more context and detailed information about the data
