

- Connect with invited local and state leaders including State Senator Linwood Louis and State Delegate Rob Blossom







- Directly reached more than 700 local officials and indirectly engaged an additional 3,000 local leaders
- Phase II will launch in Spring 2022 and will include creation of 3 – 4 additional modules, an online resource hub and a train the trainer program
