After graduate school, she worked with the Virginia Outdoors Foundation, where she used her data skills to convert lengthy conservation easements into a functional database. This original database was then moved into a larger dataset and used/curated by DCR.

She was introduced to the VA DEQ after getting a chance to intern under Dr. Tish Robertson. During this time, she learned extensively about how Chlorophyll moves through the James River and helped site a new sampling location in the James. Shortly afterwards, she was hired onto the CBP team and began work on Virginia's Phase III WIP. She has since become deeply involved in the broader CBP, and an active participant on the LUWG, Modeling WG, Watershed Technical WG, and others. She will bring a wealth of knowledge, experience, and passion to the role of Co-Chair of the LUWG.
