Support for Soil Health Integration B25 Framework:

- Broad coalition of support expressed for incorporating soil health into the B25 framework as a priority, healthy soil function is foundational for achieving watershed health, conservation, and restoration goals, with the capacity to improve both ecological and economic outcomes
- What this looks like within the B25 framework is TBD; dependent upon the future CBP structure and organization
- Cross-collaborative action team (members of B25 Small Climate group, Advisory Committees, STAR, WQ/Healthy Watershed GITS/WGs) dedicated to ensuring that approved strategies/approaches for advancing soil health are integrated into the new framework

Examples/Suggestions:

- ➤ Advisory committee focus on soil health integration—recruit subject matter experts and practitioners to discuss the state of the science and implementation approaches
- > Incorporate soil health into the Resiliency Workgroup framework as an influencing factor to consider
- > Consider soil health as a focus within the Land Goal (within 4 streamlined goal areas)
