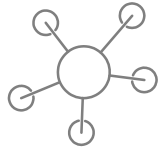
- ▶ Last funding opportunity in FY 2021

# 2023 Highlights



## ► 2 Priority Areas:

- Applied science investigating the impacts of climate change, habitat quality, and/or changing environmental variables on fish and shellfish resources to inform sustainable and ecosystem-based fisheries management.
- Innovative methods to assess the effectiveness of nearshore habitat restoration in enhancing fish communities and providing ecosystem resilience in response to climate change.



## Priority #1 - projects should...

- ▶ Involve field studies **and/or** analysis of existing information
- ▶ Develop **quantitative relationships** that can be reproduced & used to support ecosystem based fisheries management
- ▶ Use existing observations/data such as Chesapeake Bay Interpretive Buoy System (CBIBS), telemetry, satellites, fisheries surveys

## Priority #2 - projects should . . .

- ▶ Develop assessment methods and techniques for measuring habitat restoration success that incorporate climate change
- ▶ Apply new technologies (video, acoustic imaging, telemetry), quantitative analysis and/or modeling

Any proposal must meet one of the Priority Areas ...but NOAA also has a special interest area that applicants **can** address if they choose.

## Middle Peninsula of Virginia Habitat Focus Area (HFA)

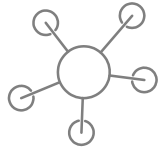
- Includes the tidal watersheds of the York River, Piankatank River and Mobjack Bay
- Applicants **may** target their research efforts in this area if they choose.
- Within this area, NOAA is working with partners to enhance fish habitat restoration and improve coastal resiliency.

- ▶ for 5-7 awards

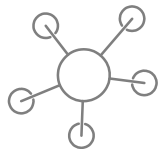
# 2023 Highlights

  - ▷ that employ and educate undergraduate or graduate students from groups underrepresented in marine science careers, including minorities.

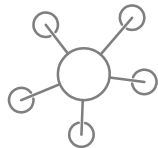
Proposals from PIs that have not received funding from the Chesapeake Bay Fisheries Research Program are encouraged.

# Chesapeake Bay FRP

- ▶ 1 to 3 year awards
- ▶ Made as “cooperative agreements”
- ▶ Eligible organizations: institutions of higher education, non-profit or for-profit organizations, U.S. territories, and state, local and Native American tribal governments
- ▶ Annual funds:
  - ▷ Up to \$150,000 annually

# Proposal Format

- ▶ Described in the NOFO
- ▶ Review & adhere to page limits
- ▶ Do not include long documents with extra information not requested



# Project Narrative

- ▶ What
- ▶ Who / Why
- ▶ How
- ▶ 15 pages or less





# Budget: Cost Categories

- ▶ Categories can help you think through actual costs
  - ▷ If you cannot break the request down into this level of detail, you probably need to think more about the project!
- ▶ Common Cost Categories include:
  - ▷ **Personnel:** salary for staff **directly** involved in project. Include # of hours or % of time
  - ▷ **Fringe:** benefits for staff requested in personnel category. Usually % of personnel
  - ▷ **Travel:** mileage, overnight accommodations, etc.
  - ▷ **Equipment:** typically any item priced over \$5K
  - ▷ **Supplies:** all other “equipment” and supplies
  - ▷ **Contractual:** any contracted services (ex. Outside evaluator)
  - ▷ **Indirect:** phones, facilities, internet, etc.



# Indirect Costs

- ▶ You must have a Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate Agreement (NICRA) in place

OR

- ▶ Acknowledgement letter from cognizant agency in which the recipient submitted a proposal rate

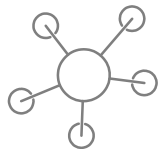

# Resumes & Partnership Letter

- ▶ Experience
  - ▷ Describe ability of organization to successfully implement and manage proposed project
  - ▷ Include description of qualifications of key personnel. Resume/Curriculum Vitae should be included.
- ▶ Partnerships
  - ▷ Include commitment letters from partners detailing the role in and/or funding of project (if applicable)



# Data Management and Prior NOAA Funding

- ▶ If environmental data (observations) are collected as a funded part of this project, applicants will need to describe this data, standards used, how data will be used, and how it will be shared with the general public
- ▶ If a PI or co-PI has received support from NOAA in the past 5 years - please tell us about it.
