- 2018: One day retreat focusing on East End Richmond
- 2019 Today: Quarterly East End Green
   Infrastructure Collaborative meetings
- 2019: Innovate Fulton has green street concept
- 2020: Green street team assembles, project planning begins
- 2021: Grant funding awarded



- 2 blocks of green street in Richmond's East End
- Goal: vibrant, green commercial district that will revitalize Fulton and bring new, neighbor owned businesses into the area
- Community Need: shade, beautification, safer sidewalks





- **Key Partners:** Innovate Fulton, Groundwork RVA, Richmond Dept of Public Utilities, local artists Matt Lively, Tim Harper and Hamilton Glass, VHB design studio
- Planning Process: team approach with three years of community engagement
- Funding: National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, Richmond Dept of Public Utilities, Altria Group, Luck Companies, Wetlands Watch

- 1. Funding
- 2. Navigating city approval process
- 3. Business owner hesitation

#### **Solutions**

- 1. Multiple grants to cover the cost
- 2. Dept of Public Utilities as an ally
- 3. Continual community engagement
