Chesapeake Executive Council Charge to the Principals' Staff Committee: Charting a Course Beyond 2025

Toplines for the Revision Process

- 1. PSC is directed to complete "revisions to the 2014 Chesapeake Bay Watershed Agreement, not a new Agreement."
 - Revisions should be developed through a "transparent and inclusive process" that actively engages "Advisory Committees, academic and non-profit partners, and the general public."
- 1. EC provided 7 stated requirements the revisions must meet:
 - Greater emphasis on engaging all communities;
 - Address water quality <u>and</u> living resources;
 - Elevate conservation;
 - Grounded in science;
 - Goals and Outcomes need to be measurable and time bound;
 - Acknowledge that scientific understanding is constantly evolving, so the Agreement must be adaptable; and
 - We share a common goal, but are all coming at that goal from different perspectives.



- PSC will take the lead on the sections on either end of the spectrum: Vision, Preamble, Principles, Goals, and Management Strategies.
- PSC will direct the MB to address the most technical aspects, the Outcomes, and provide recommendations for PSC approval.
- PSC will direct MB to propose a simplified and streamlined structure and process for the partnership's Structure and Governance

PSC/MB Collaboration and Upcoming Meetings

- Close communication between PSC and MB members is crucial:
 - Open MB meetings to PSC members;
 - Host "joint" meetings; and
 - PSC members are urged to stay in contact with their MB representatives.
- Both MB and PSC have draft processes for their respective parts of this revision process.
- With all (15) MB meetings and (5) PSC meetings scheduled for 2025, it is important to align and tightly coordinate plans at both levels.
 - Remain open to possible additional meetings that may be needed!




Proposed Timelines: Q2

PSC approves all changes for public release on July 1st (additional PSC meeting or over email after June 12?)




Proposed Timelines: Q3

Aug. 20th


- Review Structure and Governance changes proposed by MB
