Coordinator updated Members on the Chesapeake Bay Program's response to the 2023 LGAC recommendations, discussed proposed dates and themes for upcoming 2024 quarterly LGAC meetings, and provided updates on recent and upcoming local government engagement efforts.

LLWG Chair shared that the Protect Local Waterways website has recently won an Anthem award and updated members on recent and upcoming local government engagement efforts throughout the watershed, including a Wandering Delmarva's Waterways tour on April 4 - 5, 2024.

B. Martinez Penn from the CBP Communications Office provided some background on the Chesapeake Bay Awareness Week, presented this year's theme, and shared some communication materials for promoting the week across different platforms.

The VA delegation had sent an introduction letter to newly elected officials back in early January and were rather disappointed by its response as it didn't generate any one-on-one conversations as they had hoped. WV - The Wandering West Virginia's Waterways Tour last June was very well received. The WV delegation has been continuing to work on protecting and restoring the region's waterways in partnership with the WV Save Our Streams program.
