

SMALL GROUPS: PURPOSE

- Guide the Beyond 2025 Steering Committee in thinking about, discussing, and ultimately forming recommendations around crosscutting, high-level topics that have arisen in the EC Charge and partnership reports.
- Draft recommendations, based on full Steering Committee feedback, for integration into the Steering Committee's final product.
- Considerations:
 - Small and nimble enough for meeting and planning; inclusive enough to reach experts outside of SC, like GIT and AC members.
 - Overall makeup should encourage silo-breaking and diversity of viewpoint.
 - Need for a lead or point person. Lack of staffing support.

PROPOSED WORKPLAN

November-December

- Small groups convene to guide full committee discussion.
- Recruit experts outside of the steering committee to participate.
- Consider guiding questions and cross-cutting considerations
- Review and develop presentations, questions, resources, strawman recommendations to guide full committee discussion of topic.

January

- Full committee discussion on topic, led by small group
- Two-day workshop; planning support would be of interest

February

• Provisional Recommendations (drafted/revised from January discussion) presented to Steering Committee.

EXAMPLES OF ISSUES THAT MIGHT ARISE?

Topic	Potential Issues	only"
DEIJ	Equity in community interaction with waterways: access, toxics? Cross-goal integration of DEIJ efforts?	
Shallow Waters	Targeted work in shallow water habitats? "Tipping Points"? Cross-outcome coordination & ecosystem services valuation?	
Non-Point Sources	Better engagement of ag community, and state stormwater progr Addressing mass imbalance? Pay-for-performance? Sandboxing?	ams?
Land / Habitat Conservation	Permanent protection vs. time-bound contracts? Protected existing acreage vs. adding newly restored acres?	
Water Quality / TMDL	Incremental goals based on non-deep channel habitat needs? WIPS and Milestones?	
Public/Stakeholder Engagement	Making science, resources, communication more available and relevant for local action? Social science considerations?	



GUIDING QUESTIONS FOR EACH TOPIC



- 3 Vs
 - VISION: What does success look like? What do we hand to the next generation?
 - VALUE: What are we doing that works? What could be improved? What learnings can we draw from?
 - VANGUARD IDEAS: What idea would be transformative?
- Cross-Cutting Considerations
 - CLIMATE: How does climate change interact with your topic?
 - PEOPLE: How can we better center people in our efforts on this topic?
 - LIVING RESOURCES: How can your topic maximize living resource impacts?



SMALL TOPICAL GROUP REVIEW

- Purpose: Guide the SC in discussing, forming recommendations on high-level topics
- Workplan: Plan and lead a Jan/Feb SC discussion; Draft and refine recommendations to go into SC's final product.
- Topics: DEIJ, Shallows, Non-Point, Conservation, WQ/TMDL, Public/Stakeholder???
- Guiding Questions: 3 Vs (Vision, Value, Vanguard) and Cross-Cuts (Climate, People, Living Resources)
