SRS Process

- The Strategy Review System (SRS) is an iterative process that helps the Chesapeake Bay Program partnership coordinate, track, assess, prioritize, and resource the short- and long-term science needs identified through the SRS and advance Chesapeake restoration and conservation efforts.
- The SRS process is documented through three documents: the Logic & Action Plan, the Narrative Analysis, and the Presentation.

 - Public Access is now a part of the People cohort and will be going in March of their chosen year.
 - We will be giving a brief update in March of 2024.

Public Access Site Development Outcome – [2020-2021] By 2025, add 300 new public access sites, with a strong emphasis on providing opportunities for boating, swimming and fishing, where feasible. (2010 baseline year)

Long-term Target: 300 sites by 2025

Two-year Target: The Public Access Workgroup aims to add 20 new public access sites each year. By the end of 2021 this would bring the cumulative total of public access sites from 1333 to 1373.
