As mentioned last week on the MB call, based on these conversations, it was agreed that we will postpone the project submission period and revisit this effort in earnest in May when there is more clarity and progress on the Outcomes. A small urgent list of projects will still be discussed at the January 16 MB meeting, as there are several initiatives that need immediate attention. If your Goal Team has identified an urgent need (that can't wait 5 months) that it would like considered at the Jan 16 meeting, please send it forward by Jan 3.

There have been a number of questions on the scope and mechanics of this process, so I'd like to share a few clarifying points that I hope will be useful as you consider projects ideas over the next few months. These projects:

- Help advance the EC charge in the long-run. Thanks to the GIT chairs for this phrasing as I think it captures the spirit of this effort. These are projects that will help determine the work ahead and how it will be achieved—for example, to inform outcome revisions, setting of implementation targets, tracking of progress and development of indicators, and questions related to how we work.
- May address the broader set of objectives in the Charge. For example, how should the partnership follow through on the EC's call for a "renewed and greater emphasis on engaging all residents of the watershed"?
- May advance the recommendations from Phase 1, but not limited to Phase 1. The emphasis thus far has been on carrying forward Phase 1 recommendations because these present critical elements to be considered in defining/setting the work ahead.

- Require additional effort—i.e., not already identified in workplans or being worked on by Goal Teams/workgroups.
- May be cross-outcome and, therefore, requiring coordination between partnership groups. Integration of climate considerations across partnership work, for example.
- Are a priority, in that the Management Board and Goal Teams would prioritize this work relative to other responsibilities.

This initiative is intended to serve as a tool to identify and address urgent needs that require broader partnership consideration and endorsement.
