

Jeff Hill is currently the District Manager for the York County Conservation District, where he oversees 21 staff and is directly involved in the oversight of implementation of Best Management Practices across all sectors of the county. Jeff has been instrumental in assisting the county towards its watershed implementation goals, and an advocate of the real-time water quality monitoring that is currently occurring in conjunction with assistance from the USGS. He has been with YCCD since 2021 when he transferred across the Susquehanna River from the Lancaster County Conservation District where he worked from 2005. While working for LCCD, Jeff was the Agriculture Program Manager where he oversaw a department of 16 staff that work directly with the farming community in all aspects of conservation within the county. Before becoming the Program Manager, Jeff was an Agriculture Technician who worked with Act 38 Nutrient Management Plans (reviews). He also wrote Conservation Plans and implemented numerous BMP's around the county. Jeff has served on the panel that conducted the Resource Improvement review for the Chesapeake Bay Program, served on Pennsylvania's Nutrient Management /Manure Management Delegation work group and has been an At-Large member of the Chesapeake Bay's Ag Workgroup for the past 6 years. Jeff received a Bachelor of Science Degree (Animal Production/Business Management) from Penn State University in 2002. Prior to working in the conservation field, he spent time in Nebraska working on a purebred Black Angus ranch as well as working in the beef packing industry. He is currently certified in Pennsylvania's Nutrient Management Program.
