- 2022 "Treelay"
- Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay held 8 back-to-back plantings over a 24-hour period (Oct 28 – Oct 29)
 - Six events in Pennsylvania (Lancaster, York, Adams and Cumberland counties) and one each in Maryland (Carroll county) and DC
 - 178 volunteers, 3500 native trees planted

- Draft charge for an Expert Panel Establishment Group (EPEG) will be ready for distribution soon
- EPEG will consider the need for a panel
 - if one is warranted, will recommend resource needs to convene a panel
- Staff/admin support for the EPEG is TBD
- Prospective EPEG members will be listed in draft charge
- Will distribute the EPEG charge to the WQGIT, if no objections over email (deadline TBD) then the EPEG will convene after the new year once support and prospective members are confirmed
