




Restore Clean Water

- Phase II WIPs and Two-year Milestones completed
- Water-quality monitoring and analysis expanded
- Conservation practices implemented in priority watersheds
- Toxic contaminants reports completed

Sustain Fish and Wildlife

- ▶ 97 acres of oyster reefs planted in Harris Creek
- Female-specific population targets for blue crabs adopted for fisheries management
- Brook trout population data
 shared for land use planning
 and habitat restoration



Conserve Land and Increase Public Access


- ➤ Support for permanent protection of ~3,000 acres through hydropower facility relicensing
- Four connecting trails (900 miles) added to Captain John Smith Trail
- 1,360 acres protected at DoD Chesapeake Bay installations

Supporting Strategies

- ➤ Environmental Literacy Strategy released
- ➤ Star-Spangled Banner National Historic Trail launched
- Chesapeake Bay watershed land cover updated and analyzed
- ➤ Analyzed potential effects of Conowingo Reservoir reaching capacity; management options developed
