




Where we work, how we prioritize






Priority watershed case study: Watts



Watts infrastructure














Stream prior to restoration

New effort to tie MWEEs to our stream restoration projects



RiverSmart Homes- helping residents control stormwater on their yards by providing lot-level bmps at low cost










Remaining Challenges

Cross- border implementation for maximum benefit

- Anacostia (17% is DC)
- Watts (47% is in DC)
- Permitting delays
- Shrinking funding from some Federal grants – shrinking budgets on local side
