



# Breeding Distribution



### Cerulean Warbler Breeding Habitat

- White oaks
- Canopy gaps
- High structural complexity
- Thick but patchy herbaceous layer
- Widely spaced, large trees












#### Population Trends: Cerulean Warbler



• ~70% of the population (1 million birds) lost since 1966.



#### Reasons for Decline

Main Reason: Habitat Loss

• Nest parasitism by the Brownheaded Cowbird (*Molothrus ater*)

# Unsustainable Timber Harvests ("High Grading")




#### Sustainable Timber Harvests

  - Timber harvesting can enhance forest habitat for Cerulean Warblers

















#### Cerulean Warbler Focal Areas

- Terrain



Common Cerulean Warbler Management Practices

- Shelterwood harvest
- Thinning (mechanical or chemical)
- Herbicide application
- Deer fencing
