Background: GIT Funding Ideas: Goal Team Funding for 2018 will once again become available, with funding for projects within the \$25-\$75k range. Proposals will be due around the end of May. Past projects for the CRWG include the Climate Smart Decision Framework, the Climate Change Indicator Projects, and the CBP Climate Data and Mapping Repository.

The Chesapeake Bay Trust has gathered reviews for the GIT funding project: "Climate-Resilient BMP" Indicator Project"- David Flores. Revisions to project ideas and the final documents should be submitted to <u>Greg Allen</u> and <u>Emily Freeman</u> by <u>COB Thursday, August 23</u>. They are looking at a date of Thursday, September 20 for the GIT Chairs, Coordinators, and Staffers to meet and rank all
