As leaders of state agricultural departments in the Chesapeake Bay Watershed and members of the cabinet-level Principals' Staff Committee (PSC) of the Chesapeake Bay Program, we congratulate you on your recent confirmation. USDA and our region's farmers are critical partners in achieving water quality goals for the Bay watershed.

Along with the financial assistance provided through Farm Bill programs, the Conservation Technical Assistance (CTA) that is a core function of the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is key to achieving the productive, sustainable farms that we desire in the Bay watershed. Unfortunately, staffing levels in our region have not kept pace with demand, and backlogs of conservation planning are an unfortunate obstacle to implementation.

That is why we are pleased to hear that NRCS has provided Direct Hire Authority for over 1500 new entry-level field office technical staff. We would like to see Critical Conservation Areas, especially the Chesapeake Bay, prioritized for these new positions, along with the CTA and program funding to support them directly and with adequate overhead.

NRCS has the respect and trust of our agricultural community. Having more of these highly trained professionals in the field will be an asset to both our farmers and water quality.
