

# DRAFT Communications Workgroup Charge May 2015

## **Workgroup Charge**

To advance communications within Chesapeake Bay watershed communities and increase collaboration among the Chesapeake Bay Program, State and Local governments.

#### **Background**

An initiative as ambitious and broad in scope as communication with local governments requires a comprehensive and collaborative plan that identifies target audiences, designs relevant messages and determines optimum means of delivery in support of information transfer.

#### Composition

The Communication Workgroup shall be comprised of at least four members, preferably from different jurisdictions within the Chesapeake Bay watershed.

## **Workgroup Task Through March 2016**

- Identify priority activities based on the EPA-approved Work Plan and Strategic Plan
- Update / develop core sets of information for LGAC members including:
  - o Speaker Kits (Slides, Speeches, Handouts) for various audiences
  - o Templates for news articles and press releases
- Review Bay Program materials, as needed
- Draft a communications strategy for the 2017 Mid-Point assessment
- Identify target audiences and opportunities for collaboration

### **Workgroup Deliverables**

- Quarterly Press Releases
- Data to incorporate into the local government contact database
- Guidance to LGAC staff, as needed

#### **Workgroup Member Expectations**

- Commit to serving a minimum one-year term: May 2015-May 2016
- Participate in meetings (held in conjunction with quarterly meetings) and scheduled conference calls
- Bring the perspective of local government to all discussions and activities
- Commit one hour per quarter to reviewing and commenting on Chesapeake Bay Program materials
- Contribute clear and focused ideas for discussion

## Value in Participation

- Share unique talents and skills
- Assist in developing communication protocols for the Chesapeake Bay Program
- Enable local governments to be more aware of opportunities to collaborate, attend workshops and seminars, and respond to Bay Program-related inquiries
- Contribute to shaping communications that will benefit local governments
