Agricultural Land Use Designations for Federal Lands (Discussion Lead: Sarah Diebel, Jeff Sweeny) Review options for federal agriculture land cover.	10:15-11:00	Meeting Materials Options Discussion Comments and Votes on Ag Options Options Discussion (VA Comments) Notes/Actions There were 3 options provided for designating agricultural land uses on federal properties. Jeff Sweeny explained each option. The first option is to shift federal ag acres to corresponding county values. For this option, federal agencies would not have loads assigned to them even if they have agricultural land, and reported load reductions would be part of the county load reductions. The second option is to maintain federal ag acres within the federal agency type footprint. For this option federal agencies would have to report agricultural BMP data for the past 30 years or a default of no BMPs for the past 30 years. The third option is to shift federal ag acres to turf. This option would maintain the federal facility footprint but loads would not be considered area agricultural loads and agricultural BMPs couldn't be reported. Before the meeting, some members sent their votes for which option they thought was best to Sarah Diebel. There were two votes for option 2, two votes for option 1, and three votes for option 3. Marian Norris explained that she picked option 2 because option 3/assigning turf affects land conversion and whether the agency is credited for

converting agricultural lands. Liz Dawson proposed a fourth option to informally credit formal BMPs on ag land. She explained that this is a difficult decision because federal agencies are trying to meet their targets and want credit for ag land conversion BMPs, so as long as agencies are able to receive credit and reach targets, they should be in agreeance.

- Jeff explained that data for the model is at the county level and has not gone any smaller. James Davis-Martin voted for option 2 and is for maintaining federal ag acres because Virginia has mapped acres of cropland and pasture and are aware of agriculture on federal lands. Peter Claggett commented that there is a way to determine acreage; also that pasture and turf are similar in loading rates, but that assigning herbaceous land cover to turf is less accurate.
- Marian commented that not getting credit for BMPs reduces agency incentive to do any work.
- o Bill Williams asked if targets are for all of the federal land or federal land without agriculture. Jeff replied that is the land without agriculture and that targets are for urban stormwater loads only, and that they are unsure how to set ag targets for federal facilities due to limited information. Sarah asked about informally setting a target for fed ag load. Jeff replied that if there is an ag target, the county load would have to be used as the baseline. Liz said that she is not in favor of targets. Greg Allen commented that targets are important to have though. He also noted that there needs to be a method for addressing the small number of federal facilities with ag and load reductions, and determine a way to combine urban and ag targets. Federal progress needs to be shown in order to avoid disincentives. Greg asked Jeff how progress on federal lands for both ag and urban could be calculated outside of the model. Jeff replied that it is probably possible but facilities need to except that baseline is going to be county levels which could be higher than the facilities loads.
- It was decided to drop option 3. Members noted that option 2 might be most accurate but that it has many challenges, and that option 1 is a reasonable option if everyone can accept uncertainty and if ag targets can be made.
- Sarah asked the group if they agree that the options stand as, option 2, option 1, and an extension of option 1 (option1a). The group agreed.
 Sarah said she would write up option 1a. Jeff and Sarah decided they

Greg noted an extension of option 1/option 1a could achieve accountability and ability to do ag BMPs while avoiding others concern about effects on the model. Greg asked Jeff if there is a deadline for this.
