Partner Updates

• Chesapeake Bay Commission

Virginia

American Rescue Plan Act – Secretary Strickler briefed the PSC on Governor Northam's plan dedicate \$412 million of ARPA funding to reduce water pollution and increase access to clean water across the Commonwealth.

Delaware

Legislation – On Thursday, July 23, Governor Carney of Delaware signed the Clean Water for Delaware Act which will provide \$50 million dollars for clean water, drinking water and drainage.

Overview of the Phase I Conowingo WIP Financing Implementation Strategy

- <u>Action:</u> PSC members were requested to review the CWIP Financing Implementation Strategy and compile one set of comments and suggested revisions per partner and provide them to Dan Nees, Joanne Throwe, and Lucinda Powers by Tuesday, August 10.
- Action: PSC members were requested to submit line edits to the MOU in support of the
 Susquehanna River Basin Commission as the CWIP financing authority to Secretary Strickler
 following the meeting. Ann Swanson indicated that the Chesapeake Bay Commission does not
 have the authority to sign the MOU. Dianna Esher, Acting Regional Administrator for EPA
 Region 3, also indicated that EPA cannot sign the MOU. The MOU with edits received from
 Secretary Garvin was circulated to the PSC for approval by Tuesday, August 17.
- <u>Action:</u> The CWIP Steering Committee sent the document to the PSC via email on Monday August 9 seeking approval by August 10 from the PSC members for posting of the CWIP as final.

Executive Council Meeting Planning Updates

 <u>Action</u>: PSC Chair, Secretary Strickler, requested assistance from the members on securing RSVPs for the October 1, 2021 Executive Council meeting in Virginia Beach, Virginia and for signatures to the EC Climate Change Directive.
