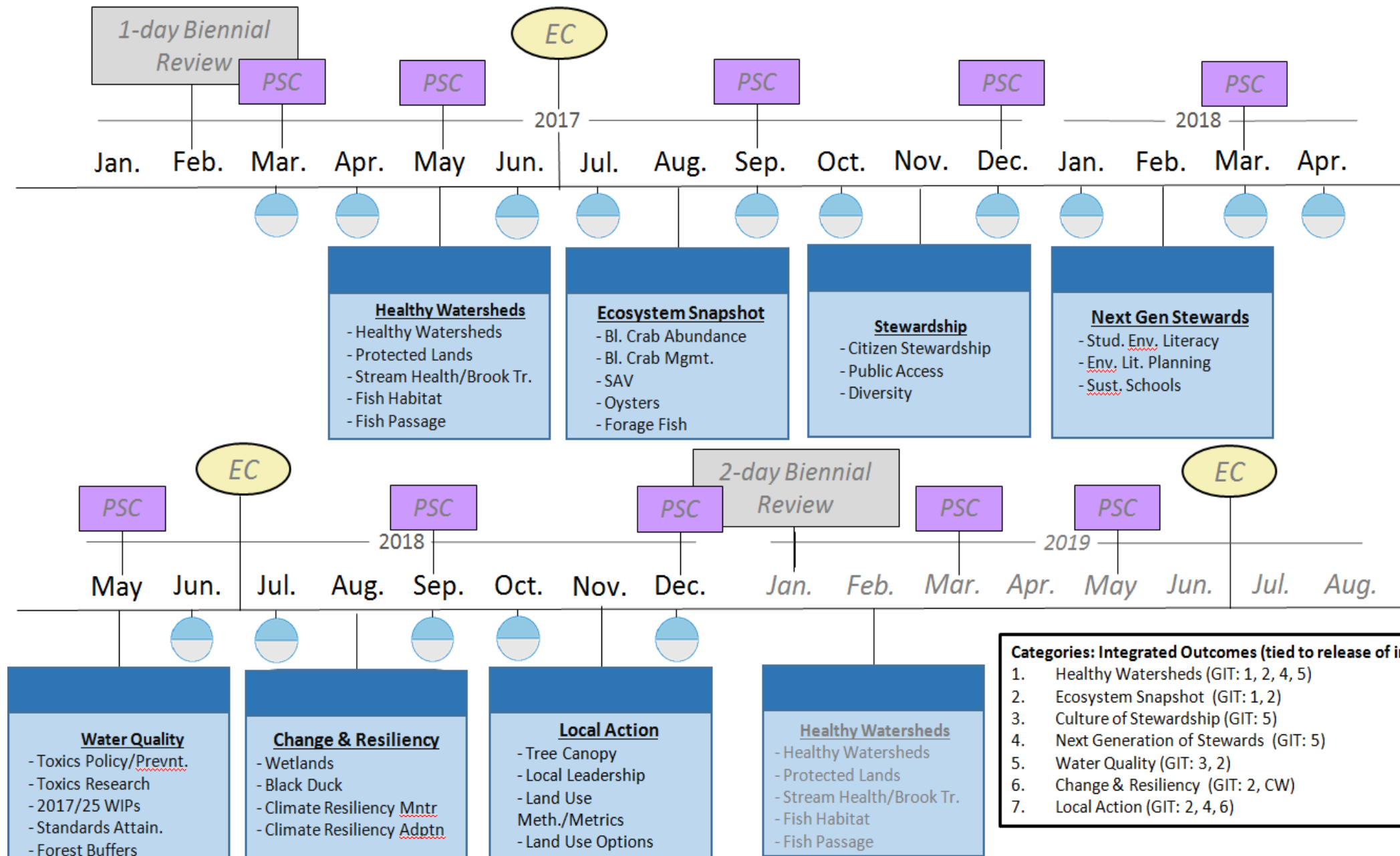

Vision for the second SRS cycle

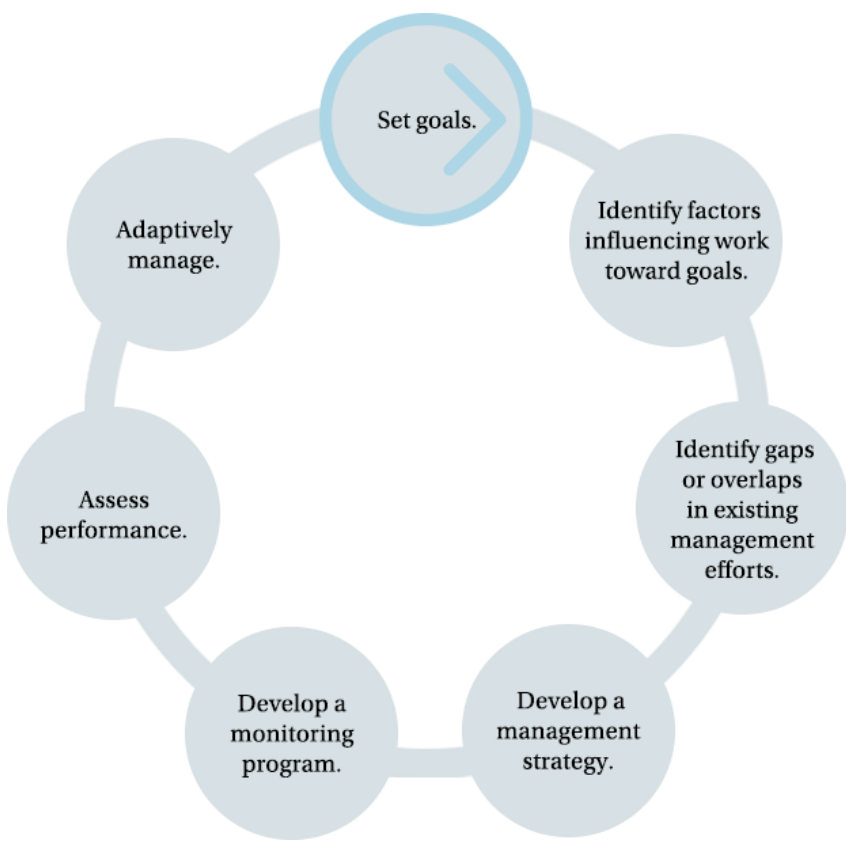
Our collective team vision for the **second cycle** of the Chesapeake Bay Program Partnership **Strategy Review System** is a system that:

- Creates work plans that clearly focus on the unique role of the Chesapeake Bay Program Partnership, through its workgroups, and includes recognition of partner efforts in the Management Strategy
- Incorporates new scientific, policy and fiscal developments in Management Strategies and work plans (example: Phase 6 Watershed Model)
- Considers the full Decision Framework (as evidenced by completion of all columns in the Logic Table)
- Runs on schedule
- Relies on streamlined processes and documents
- Includes and amplifies what's gone right in the first round!

Biennial Strategy Review System (SRS)

The Chesapeake Bay Program's Biennial Strategy Review System (SRS) is the adaptive management-based review process by which the Partnership seeks to meet the following Chesapeake Bay Watershed Agreement commitment:

"Goal Implementation Teams will re-evaluate biennially and update strategies as necessary, with attention to changing environmental and economic conditions. Partners may identify policy changes to address these conditions and minimize obstacles to achieve the Outcomes."

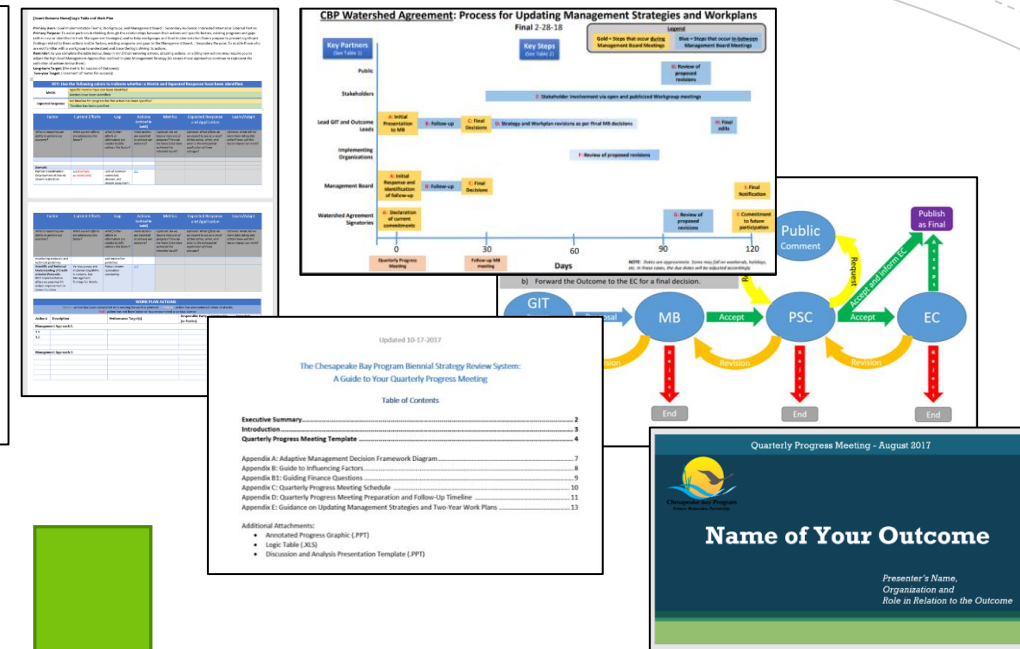
