
# Volunteers monitoring the West River





#### Bacteria levels are reported weekly on the "Swim Guide" app, other parameters reported in the annual Report Card









# Volunteers from the USAF 7<sup>th</sup> Intelligence Squadron based at Fort Meade helped the kids




