Data informing current conditions:

- 1. <u>land use, current and historic</u> (1980+) with descriptions of the codes and methods used to develop the data.
- 2. impervious surfaces
- 3. other land cover (e.g., tree canopy, turf grass, herbaceous vegetation)
- 4. <u>extractive areas</u> (e.g., quarries, active and reclaimed surface mines, shale gas pads and related pipelines and roads)
- 5. <u>sewer service areas</u> (current and proposed future service areas)
- 6. stormwater regulated areas (latest version as defined by each state)
- 7. <u>zoning</u> (consistent with latest comprehensive plan) with keys to interpret codes, and generalized as needed to correspond with Phase 6 land uses
- 8. <u>protected lands</u> (including parks, recreation areas, and other county-owned lands unavailable for future development)

Data informing future conditions:

- 1. <u>priority reinvestment/ growth areas</u>, designated growth areas, urban renewal/reinvestment zones, etc.
- 2. <u>actively planned and/or permitted developments</u> (excluding approved but expired permits)
- 3. <u>special environmental protection areas</u>* (e.g., Critical Areas, Chesapeake Bay Preservation Areas, riparian buffers, erosion prone soils, flood zones, habitat protection areas)
- 4. rail transit stations (current and proposed)
- 5. <u>conservation priority areas</u> (e.g., agricultural districts, green infrastructure hubs and/or corridors, rural legacy areas)
- 6. planned transportation improvements
- 7. other data informing future land use
