

Principals' Staff Committee October 8, 2020

Actions/Decisions

EC DEIJ Statement and PSC DEIJ Action Statement

- <u>Decision</u>: The PSC agreed to convene an Action Team that will develop a draft Implementation
 Plan for the *DEIJ Statement* and *PSC DEIJ Action Statement* within 6 months of the signing of the
 DEIJ Statement. The Action Team will report directly to the PSC. The Action Team will provide
 updates to the Management Board.
- <u>Action</u>: Partners are asked to provide volunteers for both leadership and membership on the Action Team. Names should be submitted to Jim Edward (EPA) and Wendy O'Sullivan (NPS).
 Note: Julie Lawson and Ola-Imani Davis volunteered support from CAC and LGAC; STAC will look into volunteers and report back.
- <u>Decision</u>: The PSC discussed the process for a Community Advisory Board (CAB) and agreed that
 the best option to pursue was Option 4 (Hybrid) CAB. Option 4 (Hybrid) is freestanding CAB with
 cross-pollination with CAC. E.g., the CAB Chair/Vice Chair or designated member would also
 serve as a member of CAC (and possibly LGAC and STAC) and CAC would be involved in the CAB
 as well. Further, the PSC called for the Action Team to meet within the next couple of weeks to
 consider the issues presented to the Management Board and the PSC for the CAB. PSC
 members provided some guidance for the Action Team's consideration, including
 - Options to facilitate participation of a diverse membership, including compensation, flexible reimbursement, travel vouchers, and other tools, will be carefully considered.
 - Whether to sunset the CAB or not should be carefully considered. An arbitrary sunset date may not be advantageous.
 - Review if there would be economies of scale with staffing the Action Team, the Diversity Workgroup, and CAB.

Presentations from Advisory Committees

• <u>Action</u>: The PSC approved the Management Board's (MB) recommendations for how to act on the 2020 EC Advisory Committee reports. The MP will update the PSC at future meetings.

Climate Change Update

 <u>Action</u>: The Water Quality GIT provided updates on prior PSC decisions and directions on addressing climate change in relation to nutrient and sediment load allocations and timing. The WQGIT will continue to provide additional information in the coming months leading up to the decisions the PSC will be asked to make at future PSC meeting(s).

Business Meeting

• Future agenda items:

- Chair Strickler announced that the draft Conowingo Watershed Implementation Plan (WIP)
 would be released soon for public review and comment. He also alerted the PSC to expect a
 memo from the Conowingo WIP steering committee on the financing strategy assumptions.
- Chair Strickler also noted that Executive Council (EC) Chair Governor Northam is requesting two EC meetings in 2021.
- o Chair Strickler identified agenda items for future meetings to include
 - Climate Change Policy Options (Late fall/early winter)
 - Conowingo WIP and Finance Strategy (winter/spring)
 - DEIJ Community Advisory Board recommendations (3 months from EC Meeting)
 - DEIJ Implementation Strategy (6 months from EC meeting)
 - a detailed overview from CBP Staff on the CBP budget.

Other agenda items suggested by members included:

- DOEE Director Wells requested a discussion about plastic pollution and its human and environmental risks and impacts.
- DOEE Director Wells also suggested developing a PSC Workplan with dates of future meetings, goals, etc.
