

Vital Habitats Goal

Riparian Forest Buffer Outcome: Restore 900 miles per year of riparian forest buffer and conserve existing buffers until at least 70 percent of riparian areas throughout the watershed are forested.

Logic & Action Plan

Chesapeake Bay Program partners have committed to taking a series of specific actions to support the management approaches guiding this outcome...

Primary 2018 SRS Outcomes:

- Stepped-up leadership (not just foresters) is needed
- Programs other than CREP are needed
- Formation of a Riparian Forest Buffer Action Team

2020 Workplan Priorities



1: Renew Leadership

- **Develop state** high-level **Action Strategies** in each jurisdiction to help focus and coordinate RFB efforts...
- Develop Natural Filters restorationtype programs with innovative financing
- Work on policies to maintain and increase RFB on landscape

2: Improve existing programs and develop new ones

Increase demand for RFB by
leveraging relevant, complementary
programs

2020 Workplan Priorities



3: Improve Technical Assistance

- Develop state plans with goals for improved technical assistance (see 1.2)
- Training and improved support networks for TA providers

4: Improved RFB Outreach and Communications

 Develop communication and outreach plans for RFB, tree canopy, land use change products, and Natural Filters Restoration Program

2020 Workplan Priorities

5: Strategic Planning and Buffer Delivery

- Continue to assess multiple benefits of RFB (e.g., stream temperature, habitats, etc.) and issues of cost, design and targeting
- Analysis of RFB Loss/Gain



Ongoing efforts at CBP



- Advancing conservation finance efforts for forest buffers (upcoming GIT-funding project)
- •Evaluation of existing outreach and communications products and best practices
- •Supporting networking among technical assistance providers and practitioners (i.e. hosting riparian forester exchanges and agroforestry working group discussions)
- •Supporting implementation of the Chesapeake Shared Stewardship agreement and Forest Restoration Strategy
