Direct priorities - measurable, quantitative, relative to our Habitat outcomes:

- Shallow water habitat conflicts
- Incorporating climate change into workgroup activities (thermal changes in streams, wetland impacts due to sea level rise)
- More focus on creating habitat in the urban portions of our watershed
- Improve outcome tracking and reporting for wetlands, black duck, and brook trout workgroups


