Refresher: What is the Strategy Review System (SRS)?

- It is how the CBP partnership applies adaptive management toward achieving the 2014 Watershed Agreement's goals & outcomes
- GITs developed Management Strategies, which "provide broad, overarching direction and are further supported by Strategy Review System documents"
- SRS documents: Logic & Action Plan, Narrative Analysis, and a Presentation
 - All 3 needed for Quarterly Progress Meeting (QPM)
 - After the QPM, a new 2-year LAP is developed, and the Management Strategy is also revised as needed; new and existing Science Needs are assessed

31 outcomes organized into 7 "cohorts"

- Aquatic Life
- Clean Water Cohort
 - Forest Buffers (moved for this cycle)
 - Toxic Contaminants Policy and Prevention
 - Toxic Contaminants Research
 - Water Quality Standards Attainment and Monitoring (lead: STAR, shared Management Strategy w/ WIP outcome)
 - 2025 Watershed Implementation Plans (and 2017 WIP outcome 🗸)
- Climate Change and Resiliency Cohort
- Healthy Watersheds
- Local Action
- Next-generation Stewards
- Stewardship


