IMPLEMENTATION OF CLIMATE DIRECTIVE

Chesapeake Executive Council

Directive No. 21-1 Collective Action for Climate Change



- Principals' Staff Committee is directed to do the following:
 - Address the threats of climate change in all aspects of the partnership's work to restore the Chesapeake Bay and its watershed.
 - **Prioritize** communities and habitats most vulnerable to ever-increasing risks.
 - Apply the best scientific, modeling, monitoring and planning capabilities of the Chesapeake Bay Program.
 - Connect Chesapeake Bay restoration goals with emerging opportunities in climate adaption, mitigation and resilience.

WORKPLAN APPROACH

Section A: 2022-2024 Recommended Partnership Actions

- Address identified needs
- Foundational and effective
- To be completed or initiated by 2024
- "Suited" for CBP-requiring collaborative partner participation, MB direction, leverages expertise

RECOMMENDED PARTNERSHIP ACTIONS

- A Climate Directive pilot project.
- Improve understanding of Best Management Practice (BMP) responses to climate change conditions.
- Next steps for implementing the PSC Monitoring Report recommendations (related to climate monitoring).
- Create a Bay-wide plan for tidal wetland restoration, marsh migration, and coastal resiliency



RECOMMENDED PARTNERSHIP ACTIONS

- Refine and prioritize climate science needs and develop a resource plan.
- Improve coordination on national funding for climate.
- Complete climate change-related activities crosswalk and promote consistent reporting.
- Advance conservation finance priorities.
- Establish a learning and capacity building network.
